The program consists of 72 credit hours beyond the bachelor's degree. At least 63 hours must be taken in the History Department, these must include two field courses, 12 hours of Hist 510, Hist 527, two research seminars (Hist 528 & 529), Hist 580 & 581, Hist 598, and 20 hours of Hist 800. 400-500 electives beyond the required department courses should be taken in the student's three fields of study. If required courses are not available during the student's tenure in the program, appropriate substitutes may be taken (Hist 597) with the approval of the major professor and the Director of Graduate Studies. Up to twelve related graduate credits can be taken outside history; related courses are offered in anthropology (cultural resource management, historical archaeology), agricultural economics, architectural history, business administration, communications, economics, historical geography, English, environmental science, forestry and range management, interior design, law, political science, and sociology.
