The program consists of 30 credit hours beyond the bachelor's degree. Four credits of Hist 700 are required. At least 21 hours must be in courses and seminar work at the 400 and 500 level. Of these 21 hours of course work, up to 6 credits of non-graduate credit (300 or 400 level) may be used. Six of these credit hours may be taken outside the History Department from courses listed in the *Graduate School Bulletin*. At least 15 hours must be taken in the History Department; these must include Hist 580, one research seminar in the student's primary field, one field course in the primary field, and one field course in the secondary field. Course work outside of these core requirements at the 400 or 500 level should be taken in the student's two fields of study. Students are expected to take at least three graduate level, three-credit, letter-graded courses in their primary field, and at least two of the same in a second field. If required courses are not available during the student's tenure in the program, appropriate substitutes may be taken (Hist 597) with the approval of the major professor and the Director of Graduate Studies.
